Welcome

Inclusion Week Debrief & Conceptual Convo for Next Year

Is October or February a more ideal month for Inclusion Week?

Responses included:

- It makes sense to do near the beginning of the year, so we can build off it throughout the year.
- People will be more conscious of including others throughout the year if we do this in the fall.
- It is early, so the work is frontloaded in the schoolyear. Some may have felt rushed.
- It was helpful to have during the count window, it was helpful in getting kids to attend.

Elementary Feedback:

Responses included:

- The rocks and puzzle pieces were a hit!
- The conversations throughout the week were very good.
- The kids picked up on empathy.
- The kick-off was a great way to start the week.

- It seemed helpful to give reminders weeks in advance that Inclusion Week is coming up and to please keep this in mind as your are lesson planning.
- Really great activities.
- Specials teachers participated, as well.
- Elementary students loved having the older kids in their buildings.
- It was suggested to have a culminating event at the end of the week, possibly a presenter/assembly that fits the theme.
- Is there a way to involve high school kids in more elementary events or PBIS lessons?

Secondary Feedback

Responses included:

- TIES teachers did most of the lessons. A few made their own lessons that fit the theme.
- The kick off was a hit. The Unified team played staff and students in a soccer game. They talked about Unified games and how to get involved.
- The majority liked the district-made videos.
- It is hard to get the conversations going with high schoolers.
- TIES teachers don't have a lot of opportunity to get to know their students. This affects the ability to have those tough or real conversations. Is there a way to fit in more TIES sessions?
- Timing was a little off at the high school. They thought TIES would have a 40 min session, but it was only 20 minutes Monday, Tuesday, Thursday, Friday. We will need to plan accordingly next year.
- It was suggested to have more activities that involve moving around, focus would be better.
- There was discussion on a need for students to make a relationship with a teacher. Have a safe space and a person that cares. This is what TIES used to offer, but there are not a lot of TIES sessions anymore.
- There is a little reluctance of when will I fit it into the day?
- More students would like to be involved in planning it.
- A great example of inclusion was editing videos to include Turkish subtitles for a student that only speaks Turkish. Are there other needs like this that we can accommodate so everyone feels included?

Opinions on Themes

Responses included:

- There is no need to make any changes.
- High school teachers/students will want new themes.
- We could rotate themes.
- We could do new themes, but can repurpose some activities by adjusting them to fit the new theme.
