Young Fives Kindergarten Consideration Placement Rubric

Families interested in Young Fives Kindergarten should enroll students using the same process as traditional Kindergarten via online Skyward enrollment. Parents/Guardians are encouraged to attend a Parent Informational Night in March (virtual), and schedule a Kindergarten Round Up* appointment if offered. Class Rosters will be created on numerous factors to best meet the needs of students. Should the number of qualifying students exceed the number of Young Fives Slots allocated, a lottery will be used to establish placement. Young Five's classroom rosters will be established on or before June 30.
