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NORTH AURELIUS TEACHER HONORED WITH **EXCELLENCE IN EDUCATION AWARD**

For the first time ever, a Mason Public Schools teacher received a Michigan Lottery Excellence in Education Award. Allison Altenberger-Olson, a special education teacher at North Aurelius Elementary, was showcased on Fox47 News and received an award, cash prize and stipend for her classroom.

"It brings me joy to see the students I

work with build confidence, make progress, and gain academic and life skills," said Altenberger-Olson. "I take pride in consistently advocating for my students and creating a positive school environment for them."

STRATEGIC PLAN UPDATE

The Mason Public Schools is embarking on an update to the district's Strategic Plan for the first time since 2015. During this process, we are committed to engaging the community, along with our students, staff, and families, to create a plan that will shape the focus of our district for the future.

In January, families were invited to complete an online survey aimed at identifying the district's strengths, weaknesses, opportunities and threats. More than 165 responses were returned to the Strategic Planning Advisory Team.

In addition, a series of in-person stakeholder meetings were conducted with middle and high school students, teachers, administrators, support staff and community members. We are thankful for the candid and informative feedback and input received during these sessions.

As we move forward in the process, the Strategic Planning Advisory Team will meet to utilize the information collected through the survey and stakeholder forums to:

- Update or reaffirm our vision and mission statements along with our core values.
- Establish areas of focus for our strategic plan.
- Draft a suggested strategic goal for each area of focus.

Our administrative team will also work to:

- Establish objectives for each strategic goal.
- Identify strategic actions that will be required to achieve each objective.
- Determine how progress will be monitored.

Each part of this process will be presented to the Strategic Planning Advisory Team for review and feedback and then presented to the Board of Education for approval.

Leading for Equity

Karlin J and Associates, LLC is providing a leadership series for district leaders and administrators entitled Leading for Equity. The focus of this leadership series is to address topics related to diversity, equity and inclusion from the perspective of leadership.

The overall goal of the series is to build the capacity of district leaders to develop their skill, confidence and acumen on issues and topics related to educational equity, diversity, inclusion, access and belongingness for staff, students and the broader community. The primary desired outcomes include increasing the cultural responsiveness of school communities in three areas:

- Leading courageous conversations (expanding vocabulary and confidence).
- Seeing themselves as agents of change.
- Leveraging data for equity.

Participants engage in bimonthly professional learning sessions focused on the following topics:

- Courageous Conversations
- Identity Development
- Implicit Bias
- Privilege, Oppression and Marginalization
- Educational Equity
- Approaching Data through a lens of equity

After each session, participants are encouraged to implement one of the sample experiential activities provided during the workshop to translate learning into the school community with educators. Leaders are then asked to provide reflective feedback about their experience facilitating the learning with their team members and staff.

At the conclusion of the series, leaders will be asked to demonstrate their learning by presenting a Plan of Action for themselves and their departments or school communities to continue the work and to align with the district's strategic plan.
