Bulldog Bright Spot

Nearly 200 Mason students and their families will have a brighter holiday season this year thanks to the generosity of Mason students, staff, community organizations, City of Mason departments, private corporations, faith communities, scout troops, school clubs, and local individuals and families who donated gifts and funds to adopt families this holiday.

Spearheaded by Mason Public Schools' Jodi Somerville, the Adopta-Family program saw an increase in requests for assistance this year, with 99 families receiving support.

"Everyone who asked for help was adopted and will get gifts this year," said Somerville. "This program doesn't work without all of the people and groups who donate and support it, so thank you!"

Gifts and food will be delivered or picked up this week leading up to the Winter Break. Thank you to everyone who contributed!











Mason High School Youth in Government (YIG) and the high school law classes hosted Michigan Attorney General Dana Nessel last week. AG Nessel shared the scope and responsibility of her office as well as major successes and challenges during her term thus far.

The students had the unique opportunity to spend most of the visit asking questions, including how to be a persuasive and convincing lawyer.

The State of Michigan supports YIG by providing grant funds that pay for 90% of each student's YIG expenses, reducing the cost per year from \$650 to \$65 per

student. As part of the grant, each group must meet with a government official during the school year. The advisors for Mason YIG submitted nearly 20 schedule requests for speakers this year and knocked it out of the park by securing the visit from AG Nessel.

Stay Healthy this Winter

Mason Public Schools has had reports of multiple illnesses this fall including Hand Foot and Mouth, Strep, and COVID-19. If you are feeling unwell, please stay home when you have any of the following symptoms:

- A fever greater than 100 degrees; A person MUST be fever free for 24 hours without medication before returning.
- Vomited or had diarrhea in the past 24 hours.
- Severe eye drainage or red swollen eyes.
- A severe or croup sounding cough.
- Severe cold symptoms or constant thick nose drainage.
- Rash of unknown origin.
