## Parent Responsibilities

- 1. Have your child ready and waiting at the bus stop at least 10 minutes prior to the scheduled pick up time. If they are waiting in your car, make sure they are out before the bus arrives.
- 2. If your child misses the bus, <u>DO NOT</u> chase the bus or flash your automobile headlights at the bus. Bus drivers are not authorized to stop. Take your child to school or call the transportation department to arrange a pick up at another stop. You must call before this can happen.
- 3. Accept joint responsibility for proper conduct of your children on the bus or at the bus stop.
- 4. Inform the transportation office if your child will not be riding for an extended period of time.
- 5. Parents will need to provide transportation for their students if oversized objects must be transported to school, or when students riding privileges have been suspended.
- 6. Parents will ensure that payment is made for damages resulting from vandalism to the bus by the student.
- 7. Develop an emergency plan if the student arrives home early or if parents/guardians are not present at the time of their arrival.
- 8. Ensure Kindergarten students have an adult in view when they are delivered home without an older sibling.
- Become familiar with district policies, regulations, and principals of school bus safety.
- 10. Make sure elementary students have supervision at their bus stop.
- 11. Parents must be prepared to show a pictured I.D. when picking up students at locations other than the normal schedule.
