- Stay on the Zoom call until the end of class. Don't check in and leave the call until you are dismissed by the teacher.
- Take breaks from the Zoom call or computer when allowed by the teacher.
- When provided opportunities to complete assignments during remote class, please take advantage of this time. Don't procrastinate!
- Ask questions and participate in your own learning. Please take an active role in your learning by asking questions, providing your thinking in breakout rooms, and being a student leader in the remote classroom.
